St John's Primary School is situated on the Benburb Road on the outskirts of Moy Village. The majority of the children come from the local and surrounding rural area. The enrolment of the school currently stands at 188.

There are very few pupils entitled to free school meals and about 15% of the pupils require additional support with their learning. Approximately 30% of the pupils speak English as an additional language. The school has seven straight classes P1 – P7 with a teacher and a classroom assistant in each class. There is also a teacher who helps support Newcomer children and a teacher who supports special educational needs children.



#### Message from the Chairperson

### Surely our school gets enough money from the government?

With the severe cuts in the Education budget, school fundraising now plays a more important role than ever. It means that our school continually has to do more with much less. The school staff have introduced a number of effective teaching and learning methods over the last few years . All of these initiatives are not funded and rely on additional fund raising, so that our children can have a positive experience and enhance their educational and non-academic achievements.

Hence it is important that the PSG continually raise funds to support our school. In particular thank you for the monthly donation of £1 for non-uniform day as it goes a long way to the overall amount raised. In addition we hold other fundraising events throughout the year; some examples are included in this newsletter.
