

Tin whistle

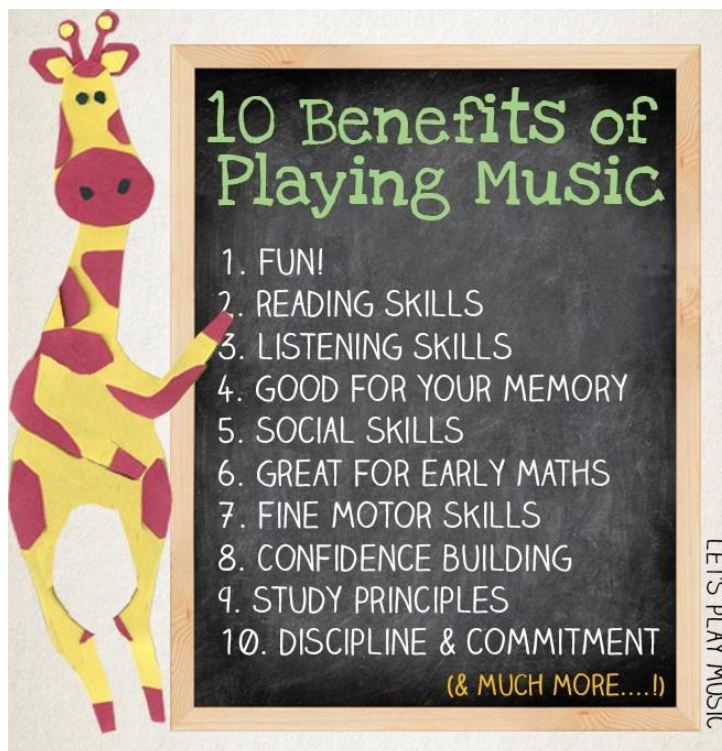


Hello everyone,
